1928 Taihoku Imperial University 台北帝国大学

Established in March 1928. Located at the current site of the NTU History Gallery.



From TIUL (1929) to NTU Library (since 1945)

Initial library installment completed in 1930
Expansion completed in 1981
Multiple college and department branch libraries all over the campus

Merging and integration of the college & department libraries

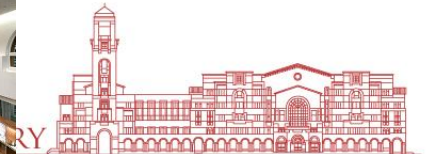


2023.8 The Main Library Renovation

2023: completion of the 1st stage remodeling (the main hall)

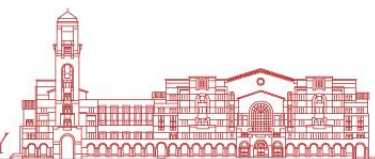

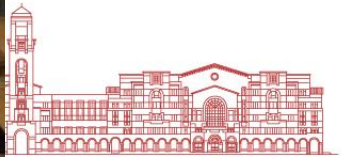


A Forest-Like Organic Library Building

伊能嘉矩文庫 Ino Kanori Collection

Ino Kanori (1867-1925) was an anthropologist and folklorist specializing in studying the Taiwan indigenous people. He was sent to Taiwan in 1895 to conduct anthropological research. His contribution included the proposal of a comprehensive categorization of Taiwan's indigenous populations.

His field studies in Taiwan resulted in numerous notes and research materials. The Ino collection curated in NTU Library has been fully digitized including the manuscripts, field notes, journals, newspaper clippings and photographs from the collection.



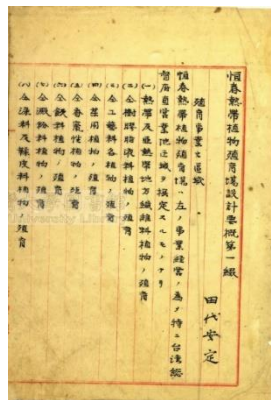

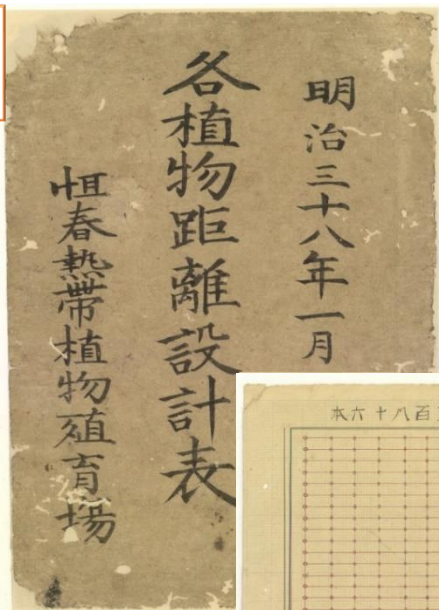
A comparative vocabulary chart of 19 Ping-pu ethnic groups of former Tansui Prefecture district (1896)

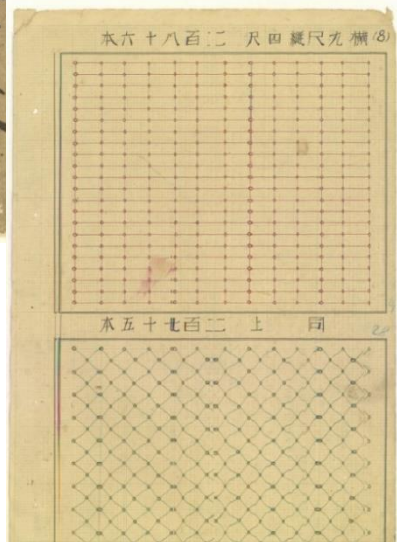
田代安定文庫 Tashiro Antei Collection

Tashiro Antei (also known as Tashiro Yasusada, 1856-1928) was an employee of the Governor-General's Office of Taiwan and the founder of the Heng-Chun Tropical Botanical Garden. He conducted field researches in Okinawa, Java, Pacific Islands and Taiwan and is regarded as a pioneer in tropical plant research. The NTU curated collection includes numerous manuscripts and books concerning his field expeditions and works.





This chart reports the distances kept between trees in the Hengchun Tropical Vegetation Nurturing Center (currently the Taiwan Forestry Research Institute's Hengchun Tropical Vegetation Park). It also describes a total of 42 methods of disposition. The disposition of various plants was drawn on graph paper. Each square represented one square foot.

There are more than 3,800 volumes of books and 200 titles of journals in the collection. Highlights of the collection are 4 incunabula and a rich assembly of botanical publications before 1778, showcasing the botanical studies before modern scientific classification schemes were proposed by Carolus Linnaeus (1707-1778).

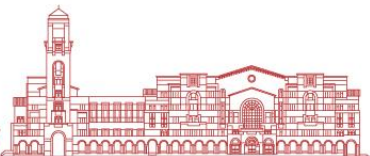
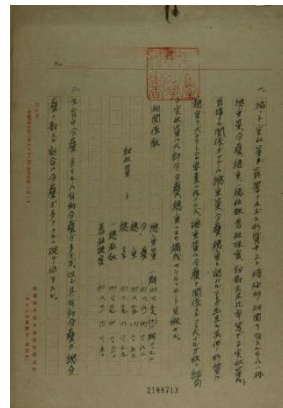
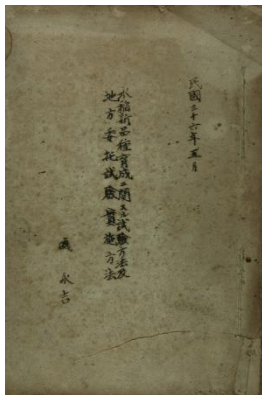

磯永吉文庫 Iso Eikichi Collection

Professor Iso Eikichi (1886-1972), came to Taiwan in 1912 as an employee of Governor-General's Office. In 1930, he became the lead professor of the Laboratory of Farm Corps, Taihoku Imperial University. He dedicated his life to agricultural research and teaching. Due to his efforts in breeding japonica rice in Taiwan, he is regarded as the father of Horai Mai (蓬萊米). The NTU collection include about 5,000 pieces of his lecture notes, manuscripts, books and journals.

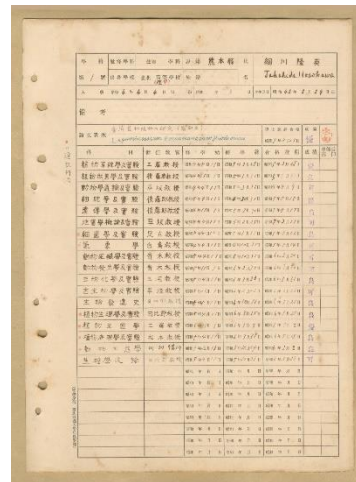
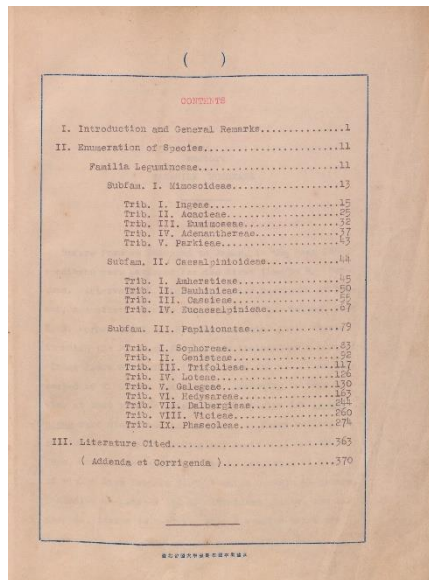
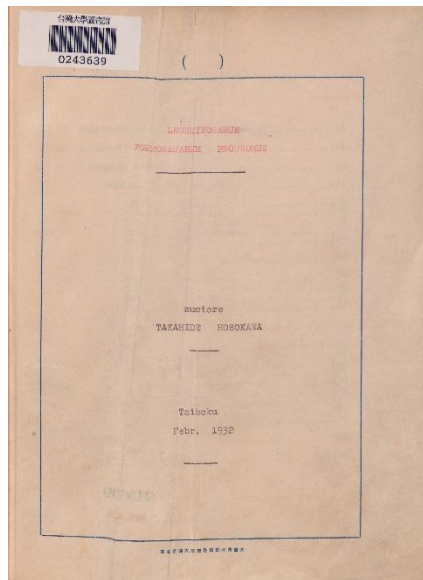


歷代寶案 Rekidai Hōan

Rekidai Hōan (also known as Precious Documents of Successive Generations) is the official compilation of documents written entirely in Chinese concerning Ryukyuan contacts with China, Korea and other countries and port towns between 1424 and 1867. The original documents of Rekidai Hōan were scattered and lost. It is believed that the most complete survival copy today is the copy preserved at National Taiwan University. The NTU collection comprises 249 volumes. It is a transcribed copy from the original by Kuba Seisei (久場政盛) for Professor Kobata Atsushi (小葉田淳), then an assistant professor of History in the Taihoku Imperial University. The transcription work was carried out sometimes after 1936.

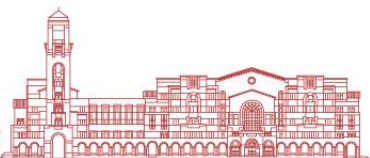

淡新檔案 Tan-Hsin Archives

The Tan-Hsin Archive is a collection comprising the administrative and judicial documents originated from Hsin-chu Hsien, Tamsui Ting, and Taipei Fu in the Qing Dynasty (cerca 1776 and 1895). An invaluable resource for the study of Taiwan's history as it contains authentic records of the governance, economics, society, and agriculture of Taiwan during the Qing Dynasty. It is the most comprehensive collection of Taiwanese governmental documents from the Qing Dynasty covering the longest period of time. It is also a world-renowned collection on the Chinese judicial system during the Qing Dynasty.

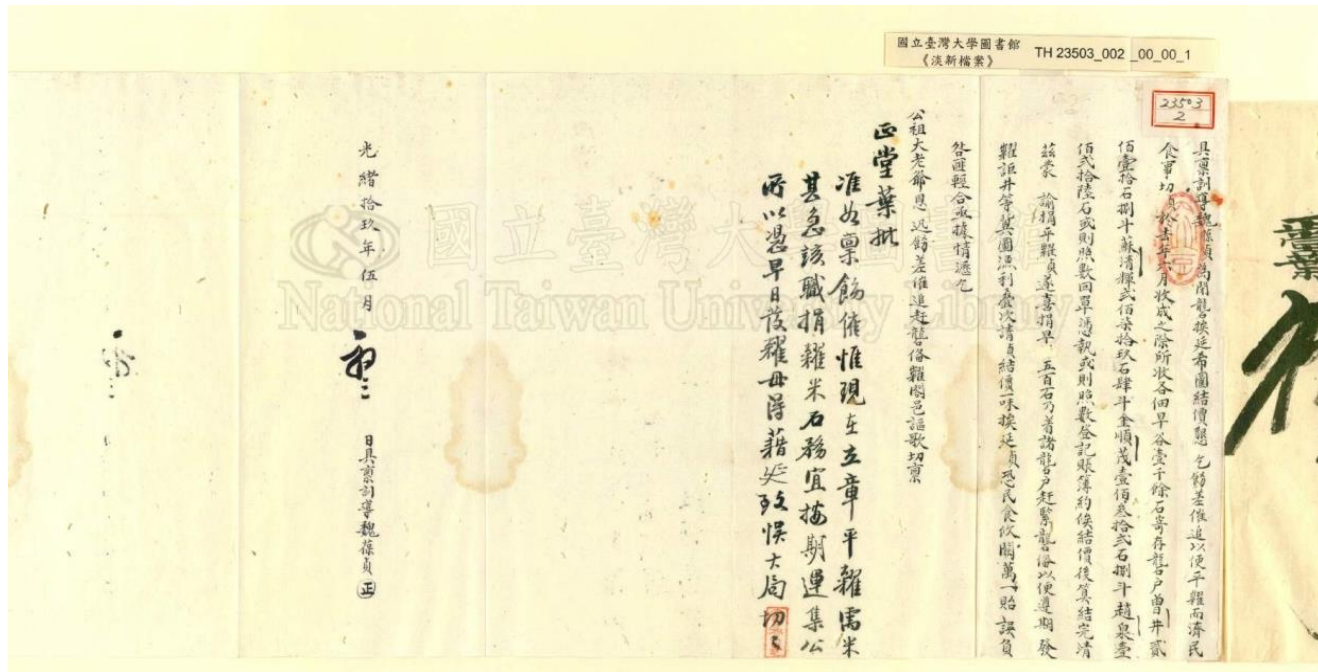
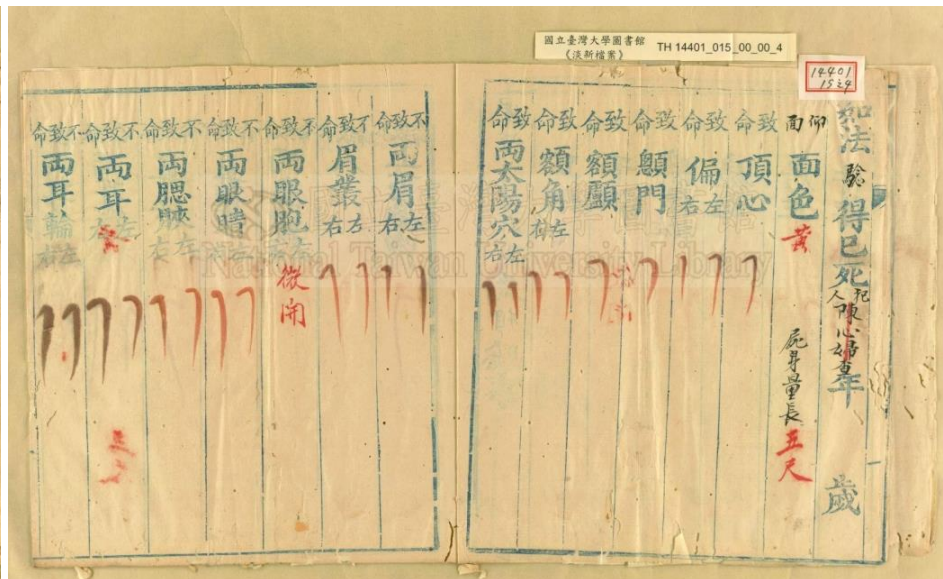


Chart for recording autopsy inspections 驗屍格 (1874)





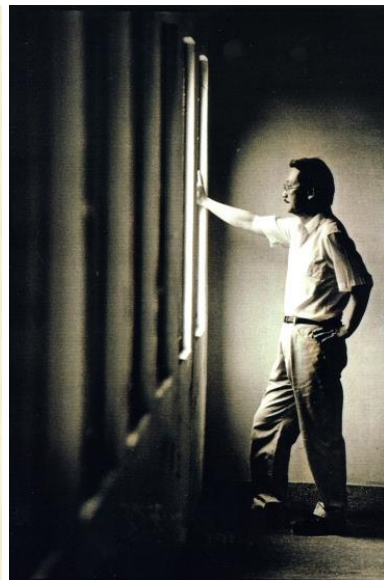
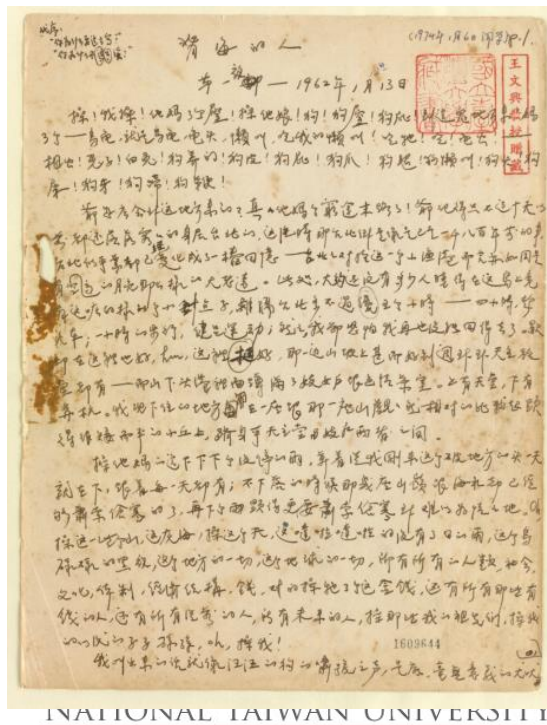
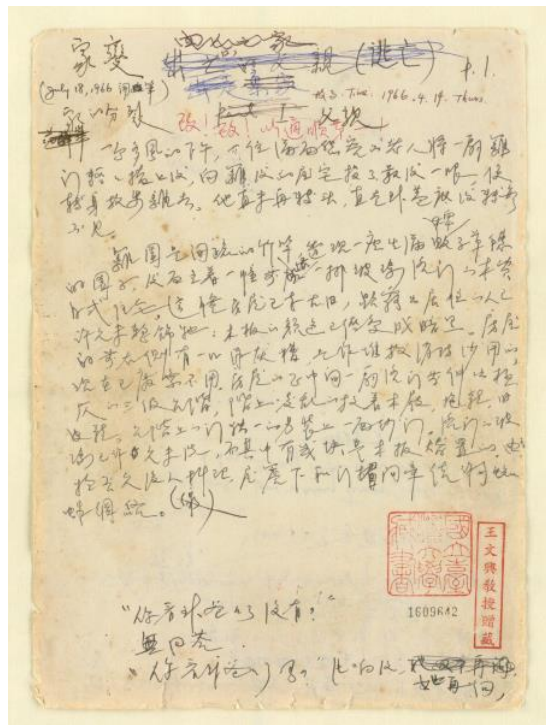

Taiwan Academic Institutional Repository

- A collaborative and joint university IR (institutional repository) union program for the entire Taiwan academics sponsored by the Ministry of Education; initiated, developed, and managed by NTUL.
- System architecture based on DSpace, an open source IR system originally developed by MIT.
- Currently composed of 140 academic institutions, which have contributed over 2.44 million records, with full-text documents exceeding 1.61 million (66.1%)
- System transitioned to the more CRIS system, which seamlessly combines Academic Hub and NTUR, offering deep integration with ORCID and capabilities for various API integration.
